

## FUNERALS AT ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN CHURCH - EDMONTON

*I am the Resurrection and the Life, says the Lord. Whoever has faith in me shall have life, even though he die. [John 11.25]*

### Introduction

The Christian Church surrounds us with love and prayer when someone we love dies. Our faith teaches us to live in hope because of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and we are promised life beyond death. The parish priest at St. Paul's Anglican Church will do everything possible, after discussion with you, to make the funeral service a meaningful tribute to the deceased person and an expression of Christian hope. He or she will give pastoral assistance in your time of grief as you may find appropriate.

An appointment should be set up with the Rector or Associate Rector of St. Paul's to discuss:

- A date and time for the funeral.
- Planning the service including hymns, Bible readings, eulogies, Altar Guild set up including flowers.
- Access and use of the church hall for the reception.
- St. Paul's policy on the participation of fraternal organizations at a funeral.
- Fees:
  - The fee for a funeral at St. Paul's is **\$800.00** be given in order to cover the use of the church, extra cleaning, and Altar Guild expenses. Please make the cheque payable to *St. Paul's Anglican Church*. This amount includes the cost of the officiant.
  - If a reception is being held in the hall after the service, an additional amount of **\$300.00** is charged.
  - Musicians may be required from either within or outside of St. Paul's. If from St. Paul's, the musician should be paid **\$200.00** and is payable to St. Paul's. If the musician is from outside of St. Paul's, please discuss a rate with the musician and pay them directly.
- Bulletins will be made and copied by St. Paul's staff. If a different design than the standard template used at St. Paul's is preferred, the family is responsible for producing the source file but St. Paul's staff will look after printing.
